Mizpah Chapter, O.E.S., Marks 72nd Anniversary

The 72nd anniversary of the chartering of Mizpah chapter, No. 6, Order of the Eastern Star, was observed at a meeting of the chapter last Tuesday evening in the Masonic Temple. Mrs. P. J. Olson, worthy matron, presided.

Immediately following the opening ceremonies, memorial services were conducted for Mrs. Elizabeth Treumann, a past worthy grand matron and a member of Mizpah chapter, who died Wednesday, Feb. 24, at her home in Fargo. As a part of the service, the worthy patron, Mr. Olson, sang "No Night There," accompanied by Mrs. Vera Carlson, and a tribute to Mrs. Treumann was read by the worthy matron. An arrangement of red roses was used at the podium in memory of Mrs. Treumann.

The five star points assisted the worthy matron in commemorating the anniversary, and as a part of the ceremony, five lighted candles were placed beside the anniversary cake. Mrs. Olson then read a brief sketch of the early history of the chapter, naming the first officers as well as the charter members.

Honored that evening were life members of the chapter, including Mrs. A. G. Tverberg, Miss Katherine Johnson and Mrs. A. W. Torgeson who were introduced and welcomed, and then presented in the East. Each was given a red rose corsage.

Mizpah chapter was organized in March 1893, the sixth chapter in the state. Sixty-one members were listed at the time of chartering, 35 women and 26 men.

Following the business meeting, lunch was served in the lower auditorium by Mmes. Thomas Greenwood, chairman, Lynn Grimson, Gordon Graham, Robert Getz and Stewart Bell. Red roses decorated the serving table, and peach blossoms were used on the other tables. Served as a part of the lunch was the two-tier anniversary cake.
