The object is to address the W.M., speak the single line given for each officer, present her with the flowers which have beem previously placed at the seats, then form two straight lines along the East - one from the center towards the North and the other towards the South so that when the organist plays "Now is the hour", the regular form of retiring march can be carried out. Secretary and Treasurer walk straight over to the W.M., Secretary speaking first, presents flowers; then the Treasurer likewise, and both descend the steps together and stand a little each side of the center. This will leave room for the other officers to ascend the East, present their flowers, descend and stop beside the Secretary and Treasurer, on the respective sides.)

CHAPLAIN: You have been faithful, loyal and true.

MARSHAL: Our Eastern Star precepts have ever been before you.
